Careers - Royal Airforce

On Thursday 18th April we welcomed back Sgt Darren Rivers (who had attended our Careers Fair in February) to deliver a Careers Talk on the <u>apprenticeships</u>, <u>roles and benefits</u> available within the **RAF**.

We learned about the defence remit of the Royal Air Force and students (14yrs +) were briefed on their primary careers of interest: Pilot, Drone Pilot, Engineer, Weapons Technician and Regiment Gunner, alongside the comprehensive array of pathways and progression available. Sgt Rivers shared that he had begun life in the RAF as a Regiment Gunner and has since been funded by the RAF to complete GCSEs, A Levels and a host of vocational training courses; he has now been invited to study for a degree. He advised our students to commit to their studies now in order to achieve their goals.

Alongside the specialist training and high salaries on offer, Sgt Rivers highlighted the wealth of opportunities available to engage in adventure training e.g. skiing and parachuting, representing the Armed Forces in a variety of competitive sports at international level (and being paid for it!) and how the RAF goes above and beyond to care for the needs of their members and families. There is also a focus on skilling staff for their eventual exit from the RAF.

Sgt Rivers brought the talk to life with stories of his experiences on tour in the Middle East and the reality of life as a serving member of the Armed Forces. I believe our students left the Talk with a much better understanding of what it takes to succeed in an RAF career and how the world truly could be their oyster!
